CRPD The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities was adopted in 2006 and came into force in 2008.

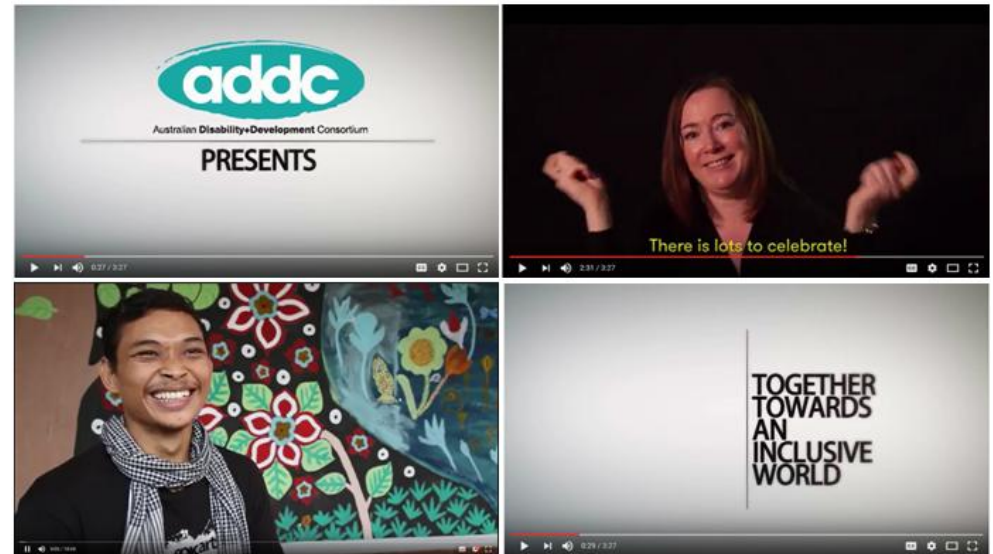
DEVELOPMENT FOR ALL

'Towards a disability-inclusive Australian aid program' is the Australian government's strategy to meet the needs and priorities of people with disability in its development activities. The first 'Development for All' strategy began in 2009 and was the first of its kind internationally.

The 'Development for All' strategy was designed through an extraordinary consultation process. DPOs (Disabled People's Organisations) from Australia and the Asia Pacific region together with ADDC members played a key role in the design of this strategy.

ADDC 'Disability Inclusive Development' Video Series



ADDC and ten of its members have produced a series of short videos (3-4 minutes each) featuring persons with disability who are, or were, engaged in a disability-inclusive development (DID) project or initiative (in Australia or overseas). In these videos they share their personal stories and how disability inclusive development projects changed their lives, benefitted their communities and contributed to a more inclusive society.

Objectives

- ✓ Celebrate the achievements of the 'Development for All' strategy and the 10 year anniversary of the CRPD
- ✓ Advocate for continued and increased Australian investment in DID, a commitment to multi-year funding and to the adoption of a new strategy in 2020 to follow the current 'Development for All' strategy
- ✓ Educate Australian government officials and parliamentarians on DID and encourage them to be Ambassadors for DID with their constituency and internationally
- ✓ Educate the Australian people and non-disability NGOs on DID and on the Australian government's commitments and international leadership in DID
